

CONFIDENTIALITY AND DATA PROTECTION POLICY

Aim Higher is committed to providing a safe environment for young people and volunteers. Aim Higher recognises that trust is essential for good support and is the foundation for all relationships within Aim Higher. Maintaining confidences is an integral part of building trust between families, volunteers and the organisation and will be respected at all times, apart from where it conflicts with reporting child protection concerns.

In addition, the Data Protection Act places an obligation on all organisations to implement the 8 guiding principles when obtaining, handling and storing personal information.

Aim Higher therefore states:

Members

- Aim Higher is committed to ensuring that young people are able to share information with members in a confidential manner.
- Members can expect that any information they give to a worker is treated as sensitive and confidential and will not be shared UNLESS:
 - The trustee believes that the young person, or another young person, is in danger or is being harmed. In this case the young person will be told that the information has to be shared with the appropriate agencies and encouraged to agree with this.
 - The young person discloses that they are involved, or plan to become involved in acts
 of terrorism.

Trustees

- All Trustees at Aim Higher are expected to uphold the organisations commitment to confidentiality. This means that trustees are expected to:
 - Keep records, files and documents stored in a safe and secure manner
 - Not discuss any information given by a member in confidence, unless they have a child protection concern or the young person gives their permission
 - Tell a member when information cannot be kept confidential (ie. a child protection concern)
 - Encourage a member to talk to other people (e.g. parents or guardians) or professionals where they feel it would be in the young person's interest
- Members can expect that the organisation will:
 - Provide them with a suitable means for storing confidential documents
 - Ensure that their own information (e.g. medical or emergency contact information, information contained in their PVG Scheme Record) is stored securely, is kept confidential and only seen by trustees in relation to their role
 - Safely destroy personal information when the volunteer ceases to volunteer for the organisation.
 - Take disciplinary action where this Confidentiality and Data Protection Policy is not upheld (unless due to child protection concerns or a court order has been issued)

Parents/Guardians

- Parents/Guardians of young people attending Aim Higher can expect that the information they provide (e.g. medical information, contact information) will:
 - Be kept in a secure, confidential manner and only used for the purpose provided (i.e. to safeguard the health and wellbeing of the young person)
 - Enable the club to ensure that members receive information from the charity that is necessary e.g. newsletters, letters and emails regarding information about upcoming events, fundraising activities, and club activities
 - Will not be sold to other parties.
 - Will not be shared to other organisations without prior consent.
